SECTION D - HONEY AND WAX

NEW! Entry Time - Sunday, August 20, 2023, from 3PM to 8PM, and Monday, August 21, 2023, from 9AM to 7PM.

Special Rules

- All honey and wax must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been produced by exhibitor within a 15-month period prior to entry, except rolled candles. 1.
- All honey exhibited must have been gathered and ripened in a natural way by honeybees. 2.
- Exhibitor's name or label will not be allowed on any entry. Small labels with exhibitor number and class number will be secured to the bottoms of jars or sections 3. to avoid errors when exhibits are dismantled.
- Judges may remove from public view any entry or part thereof which, in their opinion, discredits the exhibit.
- 5. The Superintendent of the Honey and Wax Section will determine, at the time of entry, the color class of all extracted honey.
- All extracted honey shall receive equal points on color within class. 6.
- 7. The Fair is not responsible for lost or damaged items.

Class Rules

- All extracted honey entries must be exhibited in 1 lb. glass or clear plastic, "classic" honey jars. 1.
- All chunk and finely granulated honey entries may be exhibited in glass or clear plastic jars of 1 lb. or more net weight. 2.
- 3. All section comb honey entries must be wrapped in clear cellophane or be placed in window cartons. Round sections must have clear covers on both sides.
- All candles and other wax entries must be wrapped in clear cellophane or exhibited in protective boxes with clear plastic tops. 4.
- 5. Fancy beeswax, Class D18, is defined as an artistic or decorative wax product that has been manipulated, carved or formed in some way by the exhibitor. It should not be just molded in a single process.
- 6. Gift packs, Classes D25 and D26, must include one or more products of the hive and may include items to enhance appeal or promote the use of hive products. Personal gift packs should be suitable for personal gift use regardless of commercial application, and should be in a box, basket or other suitable container.
- 7. All photographs will be approximately 8"x 10" in size and should be matted and framed appropriately.
- An Amateur is defined as one who makes less than 20% of their income from photography. 8.
- Judges' score sheets are available for exhibitors at the Farm and Garden Office.
- Exhibitors are limited to 1 entry per class. Exception: An entry can be made in either Class 13 or Class 14, not both. 10.

The display may include pictures and text or charts, but not beekeeping equipment, tools, observation hives, baked goods or honey in opaque containers, nor purchased products.

The purpose of the display is to promote the beekeeping industry by presenting its products, equipment and educational material. The display must include the name of the beekeeping organization. It must be a 3-dimensional display and fill a table 3' deep x 6' wide. The height of the display should be at least 3', but may be up to 8' high. Display must have a backdrop. Display may include honey in glass or plastic containers, (with or without labels), beeswax, other bee products, beekeepers equipment, or educational material approved by the Farm and Garden Department. Two of the ten Maryland Bee Associations will be invited to exhibit on a rotating basis approximately every 5 years.

Prize-winning honey should...

- Be clean and free from foam
- Be free from crystals and particles
- Contain less than 18.6% water
- Be in a clean container in good condition
- Be filled to the proper level
- Taste good, not fermented or overheated

Prize-winning beeswax should be...

- Lemon-yellow in color
- Clean (no propolis, honey or other impurities)
- Free from cracking and blemishes
- Of the proper weight for entry
