#### SPECIAL RULES

- 1. This is a sanctioned American Dairy Goat Association show and their rules shall govern for Junior Show and Senior Show. The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned.
- 2. Milk handling regulations will be posted. All milk must be dumped in a specified Dump.
- 3. No exhibitor can win more than one money in a group class except Produce of Dam and then two different dams must be represented.

- Pens available 9AM, Thursday, September 7th
- \* Must be in place 1PM, Thursday, September 7th
- Must be checked-in 4PM, Thursday, September 7th
- Released following Dairy Goat show on Saturday, September 9th

\*Exceptions are made only if traveling 150 miles or more. Then the in-place time will be 2PM with prior notification.

- Any changes must be made at the time of check-in. No papers will be checked Friday morning.
- 6. All animals in order to be eligible for group classes must be entered and shown in their respective individual classes.
- 7. Initial bedding will be straw.
- 8. Substitutions may be made only within breed and sanctioned show, i.e. junior show or senior show. These must be made at time of paper check in.
- 9. Penning requests must be made directly to <u>RREnsor@comcast.net</u>. Changes in pen assignments must be made to <u>RREnsor@comcast.net</u>
- 10. Group classes MUST be pre-entered. Random registration paper/tattoo check will be conducted.
- 11. No more than 2 entries per exhibitor in any individual class and only one entry per exhibitor in any group class (except Produce of Dam). Different dams must be represented with each group entry.
- 12. The Show Chairman reserves the right to change the show order in order to make the show run smoothly.
- 13. A separate entry sheet for each exhibitor (as listed on ADGA registration paper) MUST be used. NO EXCEPTIONS ALLOWED.
- 14. All Senior Does, of each breed, will show on the first day. All Junior Does, of each breed, will show on the second day.
- 15. Dress Code No tank tops, blue jeans or hats can be worn. White shorts or black, tan or white pants are required. Proper footwear and closed toed footwear.
- 16. If you have entered animals and have decided that you will NOT be bringing those entered animals, please call the superintendent.
- 17. NEW!!! Initial bedding will not be provided in 2023. Shavings & Straw will be available for pre-purchase via the Internet Entry System and will be available for pick-up on grounds with receipt of purchase.
- 18. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-ENTERED.
