# SPECIAL RULES DEPARTMENT B – BEEF CATTLE

- 1. No exhibitors, individuals, assisting exhibitors, or member owners shall be allowed to use any artificial color or coloring agents on any animals exhibited. The Fair may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers are allowed in designated makeup areas. Fitting of animals must be done in the housing areas (the area/stalls/aisle) that are assigned upon arrival to the Maryland State Fairgrounds. No fitting will be allowed in the makeup area, around the makeup area, or outside of the Cow Palace.
- 2. All animals in order to be eligible for group classes must be entered and shown in their respective individual classes. NO COWS will be allowed in group classes.
- 3. Facilities to wash animals are located outside the cattle building at the north and southwest sides. No animals may be washed inside the building or any location except these designated wash areas. Animals may not be tied to the spigot rails of the wash racks.
- 4. Trimming, blocking or squeeze chutes are to be used in areas designated by the Livestock General Superintendent, Dave Brauning. No other areas may be used.
- 5. Registration certificates for each animal must be furnished and available anytime during the fair. Certificates will be checked prior to show day. All animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor.
- 6. Cattle will be accepted for housing under the following schedule:

Stalls will be available on **Thursday**, **August 24**<sup>th</sup> **at 8 AM**Cattle must be in place and registration papers verified by **Friday**, **August 25**<sup>th</sup> **at 5 PM**Cattle will be released on **Sunday**, **August 27**<sup>th</sup> **at 6 PM** 

## EXHIBITORS MAY NOT DISMANTLE THEIR EXHIBITS UNTIL ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THEIR RELEASE TIME.

- 8. Nurse cows are not permitted.
- 9. At NO time will any person under the age of 8 be permitted in the show ring.
- 10. No animals will be permitted outside the show ring except in the designated aisles leading to and from the show ring.
- 11. Classes may be combined at the discretion of the Beef Cattle Superintendent. If any breed listed above does not have 20 or more animals, that breed may be combined under the AOB category.
- 12. All exhibitors will be assigned exhibit space regardless of the number of animals entered. If you wish to make a stalling request, include this information on your entry forms or email <a href="mailto:request">RREnsor@comcast.net</a> prior to July 31st.
- 13. Tie-Outs will be available starting at 8PM each evening. There is to be NO PENS in the tie-out areas.
- 14. All exhibitors must abide by the following code of ethics:

## BEEF CATTLE SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in the show ring of registered beef cattle and steers.

- Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- 2. Treating the animal, internally or externally, with an irritant or counterirritant, or other substance to artificially improve the conformation.
- 3. Surgery or insertion of foreign material under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body.
- 4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
- 5. Excessive manipulation of hair.
- 6. Use of artificial hair except for false switches.
- 7. Unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of showmen.
- 8. Improper fitting practices.

Practices that will be encouraged to enhance the image of the show are:

- Uniformity of attire for exhibitors in the show ring.
- 2. Recognize good herdsmanship and exhibits in the barn.
- 3. Ethics are an individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. Violations of these policies are subject to disciplinary actions to include not awarding any premium or ribbons and expulsion from the show ring.

#### BEEF CLASSES

Angus - Section 1

The first-place animal in all breeds will be paid \$100.00. All other animals shown will receive \$70.00 regardless of placing.

## GROUP CLASSES

Group Classes will pay five (5) places only. \$100 for  $1^{st}$ , \$80 for  $2^{nd}$ , \$60.00 for  $3^{rd}$  and \$40.00 for  $4^{th}$  &  $5^{th}$ . Group classes include B27, B52-B57.

#### SUPREME CHAMPIONS

The Grand Champion Heifer, Bull and Cow-Calf of each breed will compete. The Maryland State Fair will offer a Special Premium of \$500.00 to the Supreme Champion Beef Heifer, Beef Bull and Cow-Calf. The Cashman Family will present a traveling trophy to the Supreme Champion Beef Female. R. H. Mullinix & Sons will present a traveling trophy to the Supreme Champion Bull. A traveling trophy will be presented to the Supreme Champion Cow-Calf.

# PREMIER BREEDER AWARD

This award to be made to breeder of a maximum of five animals accumulating the most points in open classes, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others/family. (No limit on numbers exhibited but award automatically figured on top five placing animals winning the most points) Ties to be broken on group and champion classes. Each breed must have 40 animals shown in order to qualify for the Premier Breeder Award.

# PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD

This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most points on not to exceed five animals shown and exhibited in the open single classes, including Cow-Calf class B1 (No limit on number of exhibited but award automatically figured on the top five animals winning the most points.) Ties to be broken on group and champion classes. If a herd is registered in the names of the immediate members of a family (i.e. Husband/Wife, Children or Grandchildren), this herd will be considered as a single entry for the premier exhibitor award. Animals must be housed on same farm.

# HERDSMAN CONTEST

## The Herdsman Contest will be judged on the following criteria:

- Educational decoration and attractiveness of exhibit.
- Attitude and spirit of cooperation with other exhibitors and Fair management.
- 3. Cleanliness, care of exhibit and adjacent area.
- Condition, fitting and presentation of animals in the barns and show ring.
- 5. Promptness in show ring

#### PLACINGS AND POINTS FOR EACH CONTEST

 $1^{\text{st}}$  - 5 Points,  $2^{\text{nd}}$  - 4 Points,  $3^{\text{rd}}$  - 3 Points,  $4^{\text{th}}$  - 2 Points,  $5^{\text{th}}$  - 1 Point
