### SPECIAL RULES

- Animals not properly identified or an animal with unhealed ear notches will be ineligible for premiums.
- Open Swine Schedule (Third Weekend):**  
NO Pens will be available until – 12Noon, Thursday, September 7th (DO NOT ARRIVE EARLY)  
Barrows will be weighed 1PM on Friday, September 8th  
Must be in place – 2PM, Friday, September 8th  
**Must be checked-in – 1PM to 5PM, Friday, September 8th**
  - With prior notification to open swine show superintendents, late check-in may be arranged.
  - In the case of limited pen space, animals arriving the day of show must be in place by 8AM.
  - In the case of limited pen space, animals leaving the day of show may not do so until 7PM.
  - In the case of limited pen space, each exhibitor must leave some animals in place for the duration of the open swine show weekend or their premiums will be forfeited, unless prior arrangements have been made with the open swine show superintendents.**Released - 8PM, Sunday, September 10th**
- Exhibitors are STRONGLY encouraged to give an updated head count 1 week prior to the Maryland State fair.
- All animals must be fed inside their pen.
- The Superintendent will assign pens.
- There is to be no scooter riding in the barns.
- Registration certificates for each animal must be furnished and available anytime during the fair.** Certificates will be checked prior to show day. All animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor. Registration Certificates must be originals! No electronic registration certificates will be accepted.
- There must be more than 5 exhibitors in a breed to constitute a breed show.
- No moneys are awarded to Champions.
- All barrows must weigh no less than 180 lbs. and no more than 310 lbs to be eligible to show.
- To show Crossbred animals, exhibitors must show purebred breeding stock.
- Crossbreds are ineligible for the Supreme Champion drive.
- Animals in pair classes can not have more than 20 lbs. difference between the animals.
- NEW!!! Initial bedding will not be provided in 2023. Shavings & Straw will be available for pre-purchase via the Internet Entry System and will be available for pick-up on grounds with receipt of purchase.**
- All animals must be the property of the Exhibitor at least 30 days prior to the check in date.
- All registration papers MUST be checked between 1PM and 5PM on Friday, September 8th – If not, animals will be omitted from showing.
- Whether or not an individual has the ability to show a boar is up to/determined by the Superintendent or Ringman. NO person under the age of 13 is allowed to show or be present in the ring during any BOAR class (classes D1 through D6).**
- Animals must follow all breed association rules for the show. Will be at the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, when the animals enter the ring.
- Animals purchased and/or sold at a 4-H sale, during the current show season, are ineligible to show in the MD State Fair Open Class Show.
- There will be 1 group class entry per exhibitor.
- There will be no more than 2 entries per class for each exhibitor.
- Entries for Swinemanship must accompany your swine entries. NO entries will be taken on site. To be eligible to enter Swinemanship, an individual must have hogs entered in another class.**
