

This auction is online only at CattleConnect.com.

Step One: Register online with CattleConnect.com.

Step Two: Register for the Livestock Fund Sponsorship Auction

Step Three: Come back between August 4th - 11th to bid on the sponsorship you'd like.

Will there be an onsite auction as well?

No, this auction is done online only at CattleConnection.com.

How will I be notified that I won?

You will receive an email after the auction ends letting you know that you won.

How do I pay?

ACH, Credit Card or Wire Transfer to The Wendt Group.
