The fitting and preparation of all animals for exhibit is the responsibility of the Exhibitor. Exhibitors may receive guidance only from immediate family members, Maryland 4-H/FFA Members and appointed UME Volunteers/FFA Advisors.

Pre-entry is required. YOU MUST USE THE INTERNET ENTRY SYSTEMS FOUND AT www.marylandstatefair.com Internet entries are due July 15th Exhibitors without internet access should contact their County Extension Educator for assistance. All release forms are to be completed online through the entry system at the time of registration. Reminder you must have completed the Animal Husbandry & Quality Assurance program to be able to exhibit your animals. Check with your county to make sure you are up to date with this requirement. If you register for the fair and cannot attend, please notify the superintendent ASAP!

Division Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Exhibitors and their exhibits must comply with the "General State Fair Rules & Regulations", "General 4-H and FFA Rules & Regulations", "Animal Rules & Regulations", the "Maryland 4-H Code of Animal Science Ethics", the "Health Regulations for Livestock Exhibited in Maryland", these "Division Rules & Regulations" and the applicable "Section Rules & Regulations".
- 2. **Entries:** Entries for this division will be received on **Friday, September 5th**, **from 9am 9pm** in the Sheep/Goat Barn. Stall assignments will be posted, please only use stalls assigned to you. **All animals must be in place by 9pm on Friday, September 5th**. Animals will be released at 6pm on Sunday, September 7th. Refer to "Schedule of Events" for additional information. Dairy Goat stalls will be available beginning on Thursday, September 4th, 9am.

If you register for the fair and cannot attend, please notify the superintendent ASAP!

3. Ownership:

- a. All Breeding Goats must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and registered in exhibitor's name only by July 1 of the current year (2025). "Papers Pending" for animals less than 6 months of age must have stamped duplicate registration applications. All other animals over 6 months must have valid registration papers in the exhibitor's name. No joint ownership will be allowed.
- b. All Dairy Goats must have been owned or leased by the exhibitor before first freshening or before 2 years of age, whichever comes first, in order to be shown in the Breed Classes.
- c. Leased Dairy Goat project animals will be accepted for show. Dairy animals must be assigned to the Leasing Exhibitor by June 1 of the current year (2025). The Exhibitor must comply with all Maryland 4-H rules regarding leasing a project animal. A copy of the leasing agreement must be presented to show officials at the time of check in.
- d. Bred and Owned Classes: Exhibitors in the Bred and Owned Classes in 4-H/FFA animal divisions must be the breeder and the first and continuous owner of the animal entered. "Breeder" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time of breeding/service. "First Owner" is defined as the recorded owner of the dam at the time the animal was born.
- e. Exhibitors must show their own goat. One entry per class.
- 4. Substitutions: Exhibitors are permitted to substitute one animal for another in any class but within the same breed. Animal must be entered to show.
- 5. Proper attire must be worn during all shows. 4-H: white pants with white shirt, closed toe shoes only- no crocs. Neckpieces are optional. Approved neckpieces include: neck tie, bow tie, bolo tie or a tied bandana. Jewelry does not qualify as a neckpiece-no exceptions.
- 6. All goats must be properly presented for show.
- 7. Artificial coloring may not be used on any part of the animal.
- 8. Teeth Requirements: Kids all milk teeth must be present; Yearlings goat may not have more than 2 permanent teeth showing at time of show; Aged Does Goat should have 4 or more permanent teeth.
- 9. Dairy goats must have a collar. Prong/pinch collars are not permitted for use.
- 10. During the show, goats must have all four feet firmly placed on the ground when being braced. The front legs may not be lifted off the ground to set the animal.
- 11. A bedding fee will be charged at the time of entry to cover the initial bedding (straw) that will be supplied by the Fair. Additional bedding (straw or wood shavings) is the responsibility of the exhibitor. A limited amount of Shavings & Straw will also be available for purchase on the grounds. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their pens; Exhibitors not cleaning their pens will forfeit all premiums.
- 12. Dairy Goat Judging Contest Friday September 5th, 6pm Please refer to "Division U Judging Contests" for more information.
- 13. The American Dairy Goat Association rules shall govern the Junior and Senior Shows. The Junior and Senior Shows are not separately sanctioned. The order of the show is subject to change as deemed by show chairman or judge if necessary to keep the show running smoothly and on time.

DAIRY GOAT SHOWMANSHIP - Section 1

Section Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Pre-entry is required. See above.
- 2. Exhibitors will compete according to their 4-H Age (age as of 01/01/25). Previous Grand Champions may not compete in any class except *Dean's Champion Challenge* (refer to "4-H and FFA Fitting & Showmanship Regulations" for additional information).
- 3. Exhibitors must show a goat that is entered in one of the Dairy Breeding Goat classes. All exhibitors required to do their own fitting of the animal they are showing.
- 4. Judging criteria: Fitting of Animal (40pts); Performance in the show ring (50pts) and Exhibitor's Personal Appearance (10pts).
- 5. Showmanship Grand Champion will be eligible to participate in the **4-H/FFA All-Star 4-H Showmanship Contest for Dairy & Camelids** on Sunday, September 7, 2025 @ 5pm. See Division X, Section XV 4-H/FFA All-Star Showmanship Contest for rules.
