DIVISION U - 4-H JUDGING CONTESTS

Division Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Only 4-H Members may compete in this division. 4-H Members may only compete in one State Fair Judging Contest (Sections I-V) per year.
- 2. All contestants must comply with "General State Fair Rules & Regulations", "General 4-H and FFA Rules & Regulations", these "Division Rules & Regulations" and the applicable "Section Rules & Regulations". Please note that these are only general rules, please refer to the State 4-H Judging Contest Guidelines & Procedures (available from the 4-H office) for additional information.
- 3. Contestants will participate according to their 4-H Age (as of 1/1/25): Junior (ages 8-10); Intermediate (ages 11-13), Senior (ages 14-18) unless noted.
- 4. Entries will be made by the 4-H member in 4-HOnline at https://v2.4honline.com by July 31st and verified by the 4-H Extension Educator. Counties/City may enter one (1) <u>Team</u> (consisting of 4 Members) and an unlimited number of <u>Individuals</u> in each age division, unless otherwise noted. All will participate in the contest.
 - a. Verification that each 4-H Member has participated in a 4-H educational program will be made by the 4-H Extension Educator.
 - b. Selection/verification of contestants will be at discretion of the 4-H Extension Educator.
 - c. **Substitutions:** If a registered Team Member is not present on the day of the contest, a registered Individual from the same county/city may substitute for the absent Team Member. The contest Superintendent must approve the substitution prior to the start of the contest.
 - d. Team Members must be enrolled in 4-H in the same county/Baltimore City, exceptions are those 4-H Members that belong to an approved project club that crosses county/city lines (i.e., a tri-county livestock club). 4-H Members enrolled in such clubs may compete jointly as a team in that project area. The 4-H Extension Educator approving the Joint Team entry must notify the State 4-H Office by July 31, 2025.
 - e. Restrictions relative to college/vocational training for these contests are listed in the department.
 - f. There is a \$5.00 fee per participant for all judging contests. An additional \$10.00 lunch fee will be collected per participant in the Dairy & Livestock Judging contests. Checks should be made payable to the Maryland 4-H Foundation and are due at time of entry.
- 5. A 4-H member who has represented Maryland on a team in a National 4-H Contest is ineligible for the State 4-H Contest in the same contest area. A 4-H member may not represent Maryland 4-H at an out-of-state competition as a member of more than one team in a given year.
- 6. Contestants will not be allowed to take books, notes or writing paper into the contest except cards as provided by the superintendent. **Cell phones and other portable electronic devices are not allowed.** While the contest is in progress there shall be no communication among the contestants or between a contestant and anyone else, except as directed by the superintendent or his representative. Contestants will be under the direct supervision of the group leader at all times.
- 7. **Scoring:** Unless otherwise noted, the top three scores of designated team members will determine the team score in the respective age divisions. All ties will be broken by the Superintendent using prescribed procedures.
- 8. **Awards:** Unless otherwise noted, all contestants (both team members and individuals) share in the individual awards. Ribbons and premiums will be awarded to the 20 High Individuals in each age division for each contest. Premiums: 1st (\$20), 2nd-10th (\$15), 11th-20th (\$5). Awards will be presented to the Team members in each age division for each contest as well as special awards (see each individual section).
- All contests, except for the DAIRY GOAT JUDGING AND SKILLS EVENT, will be held on Saturday, August 30th.

Section Rules & Regulations:

- 1. There is a \$5.00 participant fee and a separate \$10.00 lunch fee required for this event.
- 2. **Counties/City may enter one (1) <u>Team</u> (consisting of 4 members) and an unlimited number of <u>Individuals</u> in each age division at the discretion of the contest superintendent. All will participate in the contest.
- 2. The contest will begin at 8:30am on Saturday, August 30, 2025 in the Cow Palace; with registration available at 8:00am.
- 3. This contest shall consist of placing 10 classes of cows and heifers selected from Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Jersey, Red & White, and Holstein breeds.
- 4. Contestants will have a total of 12 minutes to place each of the five heifer classes and non-reason cow classes. Placing cards will be collected after the total allocated time for each class has expired. Ring Procedure Placings will be as follows (activity/minutes): Circle the ring clockwise (2 minutes), Head to Tail (3 minutes), Circle the ring counterclockwise (2 minutes), Side by Side (3 minutes), Head to Tail (2 minutes).
- 5. Juniors will be required to give 1 set of Oral Reasons on the cow classes, Intermediates will be required to give 2 sets and seniors will be required to give 4 sets.

 Oral Reasons will be required on 4 classes of cows. A total of 20 minutes will be available for oral reason classes (activity/minutes): Head to Tail (1 minute),

 Circle the ring clockwise (2 minutes), Side by Side (2 minutes), Head to Tail (2 minutes).
- 6. A designated number of High Senior Individuals, who are available for further training on Sunday, August 31st, will make up the group from which four (4) may be selected to represent MD 4-H at the World Dairy Expo and four (4) may be selected to represent Maryland 4-H at the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE).
- 7. A 4-H member who is participating in or has completed post-secondary course work in Dairy Cattle Judging or Dairy Cattle Evaluation is not eligible. A 4-H member who has participated in a post-secondary Dairy Cattle Judging Contest is not eligible.

- 1. There is a \$5.00 participant fee and a separate \$10.00 lunch fee required for this event.
- 2. The contest will begin at 9:00am on Saturday, August 30th in the Cow Palace.
- 3. This contest shall consist of placing not less than 9 classes of breeding and market animals selected from Beef Cattle, Sheep, Swine and Meat Goats.
- 4. Juniors will be required to give 1 set of Oral Reasons (the particular species will be rotated every year: 2025 Swine, 2026 Sheep and 2027 Beef). Intermediates will be required to give 3 sets (one per species) and Seniors will be required to give 4 sets. Seniors will have a total of 12 minutes to place each class with an additional 3 minutes for Reasons classes. Any potential goat classes will be placing classes only, no reasons.
- 5. A designated number of High Senior Individuals, who are available for further training on Sunday, August 31st and Monday, September 1st will make up the group from which four (4) may be selected to represent Maryland 4-H at the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) Contest in Louisville, KY and four (4) may be selected to represent Maryland 4-H at the Keystone International Livestock Expo (KILE) Contest in Harrisburg, PA.
- 6. A 4-H member is not eligible to participate in this contest if they have participated in any post-secondary (university, college, junior college, or technical school) competitive event of a similar nature and in the same subject matter area. A 4-H member may not be enrolled in or have completed a post-secondary course in visual livestock evaluation and/ or carcass evaluation.
