- 3. An amateur is defined as one who makes less than 20% of their income from plants and flowers.
- 4. Containers for Arrangement classes must be marked on the bottom of the container with the exhibitor's name and address. Do not use a valuable container.
- 5. Fair personnel can remove wilted or unsightly exhibits at any time.
- 6. No extra foliage is allowed in any horticultural class.
- 7. The decision of the judges will be final.

VEGETABLE CATEGORY

- 1. Each exhibitor is limited to 1 entry per class.
- 2. All exhibits are to be grown by exhibitor, except the Decorated Pumpkin Classes. See Decorated Pumpkin specific criteria below.
- 3. Quantities specified in the exhibit list will be strictly adhered to.
- 4. Include variety, if known, on tag when entering exhibit.
- 5. The Fair is not responsible for lost or damaged items.
- 6. The decision of the judges will be final.

Basis for Judging

Exhibits will be judged on the basis of quality, condition, uniformity and trueness to variety. In order to rate highest in quality the product must be in the best edible stage. It should be free from blemishes caused by disease, insects, or other factors. The term "uniformity" applies to size, shape and color as representative of the variety. The average size from the commercial standpoint, rather than the largest specimens, should be exhibited.

No electrical device may be used and no stencils or kits permitted. Materials of any kind may be pinned and/or glued to the pumpkin. Painting or drawing on the pumpkin is allowed. Judging criteria will include originality, creativity, workmanship, overall appearance.
