### SPECIAL RULES

- This is a sanctioned American Dairy Goat Association show and their rules shall govern for Junior Show and Senior Show. The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned.
- Milk handling regulations will be posted. All milk must be dumped in a specified Dump.
- No exhibitor can win more than one money in a group class except Produce of Dam and then two different dams must be represented.
- Dairy Goat Schedule:**  
Pens available – 9AM, Thursday, September 4th  
\* Must be in place - 1PM, Thursday, September 4th  
Must be checked-in - 4PM, Thursday, September 4th  
**Released following Dairy Goat show on Saturday, September 6th**  
**\*Exceptions are made only if traveling 150 miles or more. Then the in-place time will be 2PM with prior notification.**
- Any changes must be made at the time of check-in. No papers will be checked **Friday morning**.
- All animals in order to be eligible for group classes must be entered and shown in their respective individual classes.
- Initial bedding will be straw.
- Substitutions may be made only within breed and sanctioned show, i.e. junior show or senior show. These must be made at time of paper check in.
- Penning requests must be made directly to [RREnsor@comcast.net](mailto:RREnsor@comcast.net).
- Group classes **MUST** be pre-entered. Random registration paper/tattoo check will be conducted.
- No more than 2 entries per exhibitor in any individual class and only one entry per exhibitor in any group class (except Produce of Dam). Different dams must be represented with each group entry.**
- The Show Chairman reserves the right to change the show order in order to make the show run smoothly.
- A separate entry sheet for each exhibitor (as listed on ADGA registration paper) **MUST** be used. **NO EXCEPTIONS ALLOWED.**
- All Senior Does, of each breed, will show on the first day. All Junior Does, of each breed, will show on the second day.**
- Dress Code – No tank tops, blue jeans or hats can be worn. White shorts or black, tan or white pants are required. Proper footwear and closed toed footwear.
- If you have entered animals and have decided that you will NOT be bringing those entered animals, please call the superintendent.
- Initial bedding will be provided and is included in the entry cost of the animal. Shavings & Straw will also be available on grounds.**
- ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-ENTERED.**

#### DAIRY GOAT PREMIUMS

The first-place animal in all breeds will be paid \$30.00. All other animals shown will be receiving \$20.00 regardless of placing.

Group classes will pay five (5) places only. \$40.00 for 1<sup>st</sup>, \$30.00 for 2<sup>nd</sup>, \$20.00 for 3<sup>rd</sup> and \$10.00 for 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### BEST DOE IN SHOW AWARD

A trophy and \$100 will be awarded to the Best Junior Doe in Show and Best Senior Doe in Show in memory of Naomi R. "Ma" Brown.

#### PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARDS

A banner will be awarded to the premier exhibitor of each breed. Winners determined by computation. In case of a tie the award will go to the exhibitor with the highest placing Senior Doe(s).

#### PREMIER BREEDER AWARDS

Awarded to the breeder of a maximum of six animals accumulating the most points in open classes, including animals bred by them but exhibited by others. Awards automatically figured on top six animals accumulating the most points. The breeder of an animal will be as it is listed on registration.

Family/Herd Unit may be considered as one breeder.

#### UDDER PREMIUMS

A 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place udder will be selected in each milking class. The 1<sup>st</sup> place udder will receive \$30 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> place udder will receive \$20.
