Special Rules

- Dress code shall be professional. Exhibitors must wear proper show attire. Pants or shorts, no shorter than knee length. Proper shoes must be worn, absolutely no flip flops or tank tops.
- AGES The date for computing ages on all sheep shall be September 1 and January 1. Final decisions are at the discretion of both the superintendent and judge.

Teeth requirements are:

- +Spring Lambs-must have all lamb teeth.
- +Fall Lambs-yearling teeth may be present.
- +Yearlings-may not have more than 4 permanent teeth showing at time of show.
- CLASSIFICATION Sheep must show in their appropriate class according to the birthdate on their registration paper except, when an animal must move to the next older class because of Rule 9 (teeth requirement). Final decisions are at the discretion of both the superintendent and judge.
- Any animals not meeting qualifications set forth by a committee chosen by the Superintendent for cleanliness, fitting and trimming will not qualify for show.
- All animals in order to be eligible for group classes must be entered and shown in their respective individual classes. In-group classes all sheep in each group must be registered in the name of the same exhibitor.

Pens are NOT available until-3PM, Wednesday, August 27th Must be in place - 12PM, Friday, August 29th Must be checked-in - 2PM, Friday, August 29th Wool Sheep Released - 12PM, Sunday, August 31st

Released - 1Hour Following Completion of Show, September 1st Exhibitors have the option to show their sheep slick shorn, fitted or both. Slick shorn is defined as being shorn completely to the hide within 5 days of the show date. The wool may be left from the rear hocks down and the front knees down plus the wool cap defined as defined by breed

- Animals must be purebred, registered within their breed association (Lincoln, Southdown, Romney, etc.), Natural Colored must be registered with (NCWGA) a Natural Colored Association.
- Registration certificates must be furnished for each animal and available anytime during the fair. The name of the exhibitor as shown on the entry from, must be identical to that shown on the breed association registration form.
- Papers must be checked in or entries will be ruled ineligible for show. All sheep must wear a registration ear tag or flock ear tag that agrees with the registration certificate. Ear tags will be checked in show ring.
- No moneys are awarded to champions **Except** Supreme Champions
- No champion will be selected without competition in champion class.
- No artificial coloring shall be used on any portion of any animal. Any animals found in violation of this rule shall be removed from competition.
- Pens will be assigned at the discretion of the Superintendents. Penning requests must be made to superintendent. Exhibitors shall refrain from making changes to the penning chart without prior consultation with the Superintendents. Pen assignments will be posted 1 week in advance.
- 15. Initial bedding will be provided and is included in the entry cost of the animal. Shavings & Straw will also be available on grounds.
- Exhibitors may enter up to 2 animals per class, but only 1 entry per group class will be allowed.
- **NEW** breed classes are being attempted this year. If they do not meet the required numbers at the closing of entries, they will fold back into their previous divisions. Required numbers of animals are a minimum of 3 exhibitors per breed and a minimum of 20 sheep per breed.
- Show order may change at the discretion of the Superintendent.
