2. The fleeces will be judged on suitability for handspinning.
3. The same fleece may not be entered in more than one class.
4. Only paper TWINE can be used to tie WOOL.
5. All fleeces MUST be TIED.
6. All fleeces MUST be SKIRTED.

- G3 Long – Spinning Count Grade 36’s to 48’s (i.e. Coopworth, Cotswold, Leicester, Lincoln, Romney)
- G4 Double-Coated – (i.e. Karakul, Navajo-Churro, Scottish Blackface)

White Fleeces

- G5 Fine – Spinning Count Grade 64’s to 80’s (i.e. Merino, Rambouillet, Targhee)
- G6 Medium – Meat Breeds Grade 50’s to 62’s (i.e. Cheviot, Columbia, Corriedale, Montadale, Tunis, etc.)
- G7 Long – Grade 36’s to 48’s (i.e. Coopworth, Cotswold, Leicester, Lincoln, Romney)
- G8 Double-Coated – (i.e. Karakul, Navajo-Churro, Scottish Blackface)
